

JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY (JPA)

The Vice President of Administrative Services or designee will serve as the District representative on Joint Powers Authority (JPA) Boards. JPA's exist as entities permitted under the laws of California, whereby two or more public authorities (local governments or districts) may jointly exercise any power common to all of them. These entities function to provide services to the College of the Sequoias at a cost less than would result with a for-profit company.
